“Thinking of your Topic” - Tips

Think about environmental topics that you may not always hear about and decide if you could create a project/contest entry on that topic and decide what type of action your team could do to make a change. Or, if these concerns can be tied-in with other issues you are finding. Research the effects and how other communities tackle the issue.

Examples:

Sports: Are there environmental concerns/issues where your favorite team plays? How much (unnecessary) power is used for each game? How much trash is generated (is there recycling)? Is the place where they play environmentally friendly? What ideas could your team bring for environmental awareness, in order to make a positive or healthy change?

Natural disasters: How can your team help when disaster strikes your community (flooding, hurricanes, blizzards)? Brainstorm ideas of how the environment (pollution, drinking water, crops, electricity, homes, animals, etc.) is devastated when natural disaster strikes. What type of action is needed and what type of awareness/help can be developed from it?
