

Career Connections

To connect this program to career exploration, have students research one local, national or worldwide professional who has impacted the environment. Students may consider such professions as: engineers, climatologists, wildlife/ zoology advocates, marine biologists, oceanographers, educators, researchers and/or inventors.

You may want to use the past and present examples of professionals: Dr. Neil DeGrasseTyson, Gaylord Nelson, John Muir, Theodore Roosevelt, Bill Nye, Marie Curie, Wangari Maathai, Rachel Carson, Steve Irwin, Jacques Cousteau, Steven Hawking or Jane Goodall. Sample descriptions follow.

Have students answer the following:

- 1. What are/were the job duties and responsibilities of this person?
- 2. What previous jobs helped them prepare for this career?
- 3. What education, skills and personal qualities were required to have this type of job?
- 4. Were/are there any special materials, equipment, tools or machinery that this person would have to know how to use?
- 5. Does this person have a routine for success? And if not, why?
- 6. What were/are the challenges of this person's job? The demands? The rewards?
- 7. Did this person achieve their career goal? If so, how long did it take them?
- 8. Are there other people in this same type of job? If so, who are they?

Aldo Leopold (1887 - 1948) "Father of Wildlife Ecology" and "Land Ethic" idea (a caring relationship between people and nature). Theodore Roosevelt (1858 - 1919) Naturalist and saw how human activities could harm environment.
